**INTERFAITH LEADERS OPPOSE
ALL DEATH PENALTY PROPOSALS**

Interfaith IMPACT of New York State, a statewide advocacy organization representing congregations and individuals from Protestant, Unitarian Universalist, Reform Jewish and other faith traditions, strongly opposes any proposal that includes reviving the death penalty in New York State, including S4632 and S00319.

"To kill someone for killing lowers us to the level of the killer. An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth leaves us all blind and toothless. 'Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord.' (Romans 12) Aren't people called 'to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God? (Micah, 6)

"Part of doing justice is to oppose the death penalty, because despite attempts to provide legal safeguards, the death penalty has not been carried out fairly and likely cannot be made fair. As reprehensible as the taking of any life is, do we really need to take another life to seek to even the score?
